- The WISD is participating in DPI's Educator Effective Pilot Program, with Ms. Ehrlich-Johnson, Ms. Welke, Ms. Wagner, Ms. Dahlke, and Ms. Foss taking part with CESA 7.
- Congratulations to "Team Goby" eighth graders and their teachers, Mr. Verboomen and Ms. Dahlke, for winning the WIsconsin seat for the Samsung Solve for Tomorrow Competition! They won \$6,500 worth of technology equipment and classroom supplies, a video kit, and a mentorship with an employee of the Samsung Corporation.
