**IX. MSP (Thielke/Goldstein)** to accept the bid from Mann Enterprises for the gable end staining with work to be done by Keith Mann in spring of 2023 not to exceed \$10,750.00. Motion carried.

**X. MSP (Sorensen/Thielke)** to approve the additional addendum duties for drama coach and forensics coach to Mrs. Kayla Mann for this school year. Motion carried.
