WASHINGTON ISLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE LONG-TERM CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT TRUST FUND

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of <u>Section 120.137</u> of Wisconsin Statutes, a school board that has approved a long-term capital improvement plan may create a long-term capital improvement trust fund for the purpose of financing the costs of the capital improvements included in the approved long-term capital improvement plan; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Island School District has created and approved a long-term capital improvement plan; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Island School District "long-term capital improvement plan" is a capital improvement plan for at least a 10-year period; and

WHEREAS, the Washington Island School District School Board desires to create a long-term capital improvement trust fund pursuant to the fund's review by the District's legal counsel and the District's Auditors:

NOW HEREBY BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WASHINGTON ISLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD that, pursuant to the provisions of <u>Section 120.137</u>, of Wisconsin Statutes, the Washington Island School District School Board shall create a capital improvement trust fund pursuant to the above law, and all of the following shall apply to such capital improvement trust fund:

- 1. The Washington Island School District School Board may not expend money deposited in such a trust fund for a period of 5 years beginning on the date the trust fund is created. After the 5-year period, the Washington Island School District School Board may make expenditures from the trust fund solely for the purposes described in the approved long-term capital improvement plan.
- 2. The Washington Island School District School Board may not transfer money from a long-term capital improvement trust fund to any other school district fund.
- 3. For purposes of calculating equalization aid, money deposited in a long-term capital improvement trust fund is counted as a shared cost at the time the money is deposited in the trust fund, but such money is not counted as a shared cost at the time the money is expended from the trust fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution is effective as of the date this resolution is adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the officers, employees, and agents of the District are authorized and directed to do any and all things reasonably necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Resolution.
