

## APPLICATION FOR WASHINGTON ISLAND WOMEN'S CLUB SCHOLARSHIP- Rev. Mar 21, 2025

(For a Washington Island High School graduate attending college or technical school)

Provide the following required information. \*Make and keep a copy for your own records.

\*\*It's a good idea to have someone proof-read your application before submitting it.

- I. **Personal Info:** Name, Address, Parents'/Guardians' names, number of dependents in family
- II. **Education and Career Plans:** Applicant's statement should include the following information, preferably in order as listed:
  - A. Your educational and career objectives.
  - B. Possible schools you are considering? Have you been accepted?
  - B. What do you consider to be your most significant accomplishment?
  - C. What do you consider to be your strongest personal attribute?
  - D. Your cumulative High School grade point average
  - E. Any other information you want the Scholarship Committee to consider.
- III. **Financial Need:** Briefly state your financial need. Why do you need this scholarship? Are there special financial circumstances in your family/home situation that should be taken into consideration? To what degree will you be able to finance your higher education?
- IV. **Recognitions, Honors and Awards:** Indicate those that you have received. Include scholarships that have already been awarded to you.
- V. **Activities and Services:** List school, church, community and employment activities, services, and work experiences.
- VI. **Recommendations:** Request two letters of recommendation, 1) one from your high school principal or faculty representative, and one from another person (not a family member).
- VII. **Please attach the completed application to an email**, including the letters of recommendation, and send it to Barb O'Connell at [oconnell1918@gmail.com](mailto:oconnell1918@gmail.com) by May 1.
